### General Instructions

#### Assembly:

All team managers and competitors for 7.62 Rifle, Clay Pigeon Ball Trap, Free Pistol and Rapid Fire Pistol to assemble at Meadowbank Sports Centre, Edinburgh between 4p.m. to 10p.m. on Friday 27th September 1974. Members of the committee will be in attendance and managers and competitors will find refreshments available. The committee will allocate accommodation and be responsible for escorting them to their hotels. As all clay pigeon shooters will be accommodated in or around Duns, the committee of the Scottish Clay Pigeon Association will convey them to Duns and install them in their accommodation.

Due to the Scottish Small Bore Rifle Association being unable to find suitable range facilities in or around Edinburgh, they have agreed to hold their competition in Aberdeen, and enclosed are seperate instructions for the Small Bore Rifle Match, assembly and accommodation. The Small Bore Rifle competitors will be coming down to Edinburgh on Sunday evening for the prize giving.

### Transport:

Transport where required will be provided by the committee of each association attached to the Scottish Shooting Council. To convey the 7.62 rifle competitors, markers and officials to Barry, Carnoustie, a bus will be provided on Sunday morning and will collect all personel at their hotels. Managers are requested to state if transport will be required when returning the entry forms.

### Ammunition:

Ammunition will be provided by the organising committee and will be available for the matches on a free of charge basis. Competitors may use their own ammunition apart from full bore rifle who must use ammunition as issued. Competitors will not be re-imbursed when they use their own ammunition, nor will they be issued with ammunition in lieu of using their own. 7.62 ammunition will be issued on the firing point. The council hope to provide RG 74 for this competition.

# Accomodation:

When managers return the entry form it would be appreciated if they can state how many double and single rooms will be required. Obviously it will be easier if competitors can double up in bedrooms.

# Awards:

Awards will be made to the first three competitors in each event. The presentation will be made at Meadowbank Sports Centre on Sunday 29th at 18.15 hrs, Sir Herbert Brechin K.B.R. has agreed to present the awards.

# Entry:

An entry form is sent with these instructions. The final date for entries is 10th September. Team managers are asked to contact J.B. Hall by the end of August with probable numbers.

There will be a registration fee of £1 per team per event entered by the individual country. Cheques should be made payable to the Scottish Shooting Council. Countries are confined to two competitors per event, but they may send a reserve team of upto two shooters for each event.

### Reception:

It is hoped to organize an official reception for the Saturday night and all competitors and officials will be invited to attend. In the event of the official reception not being possible then a dinner will be arranged at Meadowbank Sports Centre and a small charge will be made for the dinner. Refreshments will be provided by John Haig & Company, Markinch.

### Expenses:

The Scottish Sports Council have agreed a grant to the Scottish Shooting Council towards the cost of ammunition and accommodation. The Scottish Shooting Council have agreed to meet the cost of all ammunition and will pay a contribution to each team towards the cost of accommodation. Team managers are asked to lodge the receipted accounts, for accommodation, with the Scottish Shooting Council after the championships for a percentage re-imbursement by the Council.
